THE GOSPEL DEMANDS PASSIONATE SACRIFICE

Luke 14:25–35 (NIV) Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: ²⁶ "If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. ²⁸ "Suppose one of you wants to build a tower. Won't you first sit down and estimate the cost to see if you have enough money to complete it? ²⁹ For if you lay the foundation and are not able to finish it, everyone who sees it will ridicule you, ³⁰ saying, 'This person began to build and wasn't able to finish.' ³¹ "Or suppose a king is about to go to war against another king. Won't he first sit down and consider whether he is able with ten thousand men to oppose the one coming against him with twenty thousand? ³² If he is not able, he will send a delegation while the other is still a long way off and will ask for terms of peace. ³³ In the same way, those of you who do not give up everything you have cannot be my disciples. ³⁴ "Salt is good, but if it loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? ³⁵ It is fit neither for the soil nor for the manure pile; it is thrown out. "Whoever has ears to hear. let them hear."

Questions for Group Discussion Week 2

Group Leaders: Do not feel you have to get through all of these questions. Go with a sense of the Spirit's leading

1. Introduction

- Share in your group one specific way God has encouraged or changed you this week regarding being a Passionate Disciple
- Give each person an opportunity to share one thing God really spoke to them about out of John's sermon. Dialogue as necessary on what is shared.

2. Last week we looked at Luke 14:25-35 and this week John spent more time on it. Read it again.

John mentioned in his sermon that when love for God is supreme in our lives, then things fall into place. Love for each other springs from love for God?

What has helped you to grow in your love for God?

What specifically hinders you growing in your love for God?

How can we limit the factors that hinder us growing in our love for God?

How can we continue to grow in our love for God?

What can we put in place? What must we do?

Consider Ephesians 3:14-21, 1 John 4:19-21

John quoted; 'I'm convinced that in our culture today we idolize our children and our marriages and sex, relationships, parents, families and friends to the point where Jesus Christ often gets the leftovers from our affections and it's unchristian!' We can also include here power, work, shopping, technological gadgets, TV, house, sport, money etc.

How have your wrestled with this personally? What is it that you have put before God? What needs to change here? Next step? What/ who will help you to do this?

3. Part of the quote from David Platt comparing the ships purpose is:

"We're not going to use this ship anymore, our lives, our families, this church, to indulge our pleasures and sit by the pool and ask for more hors d'oeuvres to be delivered to us. Instead, we're going to transform everything to say how can we give our lives for the sake of accomplishing this mission.

On the cruise ship/ mission ship continuum where your life is primarily a cruise ship is a ONE and your life being primarily a mission ship is a TEN, what number would you rank your life at the moment? Are you ok with that number ranking? If not, what will help you move up the scale? What will need to happen? What is 1 step you can take that will move you along? Who can help you in this? How? What may make it difficult for you to move?

- 4. Read Luke 14:33. What does it mean for you to give up everything? Discuss in your group.
- 5. Quietly sit before God now. Ask him to put one person on your heart who you can minister the love of Christ to this week in some way.
