Richard Foster (Celebration of Discipline) writes; 'More than any other way the grace of humility is worked into our lives through the discipline of service...Nothing disciplines the desires of the flesh like service, and nothing transforms the desires of the flesh like serving in hiddenness.



The flesh whines against service but screams against hidden service. It strains and pulls for honour and recognition'

- How can service, and specifically hidden service, help us to humble ourselves.
- What else has helped you to humble yourself and serve people?
- What would be your response if someone asked you why you put yourself out and served people?
- What affect does this verse have on you and your service?
