- 3. Henri Nouwen makes this statement:

'At issue here is this question: "To whom do I belong? To God or to the world?" Many of my daily preoccupations suggest that I belong more to the world than to God. A little criticism makes me angry, and a little rejection makes me depressed. A little praise raises my spirits, and a little success excites me...Often I am like a small boat on the ocean, completely at the mercy of the waves.'

How does that apply to your life? Share as you wish.



4. What are some of the signs that you and others may be struggling with 'approval addiction'?

What does 1 Corinthians 4:3-5 and Galatians 1:10 say about this?

- 5. What areas of your performance are you most tempted to use as a measure of your worth and what are you doing to fight this tendency? What else will help you in this?
- 6. Read Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18
- 7. In this passage what is Jesus trying to teach us about secrecy in our faith?

8. What do we lose as soon as we begin to announce or flaunt our acts of service and our spiritual accomplishments?
