Questions for John 10 sermon July 28, 2013

Do not feel pressured to get through all these.

If you heard David's sermon, what new understanding of God did you gain? What were you reminded of that was significant for you?

Read through John 10.

What does this chapter specifically encourage you about Jesus? How does this impact on you?

Share how satan has stolen or destroyed your life? How has God redeemed that?

If satan was to get you, where would he get you? What have you done to minimise that?

Jesus said He has come that you may have life to the full (v10). Share personally what this has been like in your life. How might you experience this abundant life to a greater degree?

What qualities in your life might convince an unbeliever to explore Christianity?

Jesus died for us? What are you prepared to sacrifice so that some of your friends, workmates, neighbours and others in your world and across the world, may experience the reality of Jesus love for them? This is not a guilt trip, but is worth considering. What is one action point for you in this regard?

What emotions does the hardness of the religious leaders towards Jesus rouse in you? How are you like them now or in the past? The image of God as a shepherd is used many times in Scripture to reflect Gods care for people. Read through Psalm 95. What are some promises in the psalm that you can use to strengthen your own faith or that of another believer

Jesus used the story of the shepherd and his sheep because it related so well in that culture. If you were to rewrite this chapter using an image or situation from today, what would it be? Share in the group some of your reasons.
