Questions: Do not let your hearts be troubled (John 14)

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If you heard David's sermon, share how God spoke to you out of it.

Read John 14:1, 27 Talk about a recent time when your heart was troubled. What happened? What could you have done? What, if anything, did God do or say in that time.

Jesus, in John 14:2, 3, paints the picture of a groom going to prepare a home for his bride. How do you feel about that? Why did Jesus say that?

David said John 14 was a love story; the implication of John 14 is that intimacy is the goal of the gospel. How does that sit with you? Discuss that in your groups. Read also Ephesians 1:3-6

What is the significance that 'Father' is used 23 times in this chapter?

How do you understand 14:6? How does your non Christian friend read that? How would you use this verse in evangelism?

Read verses 13, 14. Is that true? How can that affect your prayer life?

What does Jesus say in this chapter about the person and work of the Holy Spirit? How does that impact you? What does verse 12 have to do with this?

Verses 15,21,23,24 talk about love and obedience. What is the relationship between love and obedience to Jesus and His love and presence in our lives? How is this different to legalism? What clouds our thinking on this?

On a 1 to 10 scale, where 1 is big burden and 10 is great joy, what number would you give yourself to indicate how you feel about obeying Jesus? Discuss your thinking.

Discuss what happens when we obey Jesus as opposed to when we disobey Him.

What was Judas really asking in 14:22?

Talk about a time in your life when you experienced the peace of Jesus. What has robbed you of His peace?
